Speaking of Speeches

At some point in our life, we realize that we want to improve our ability to comfortably speak before a group of people. Philadelphia's First Toastmasters, chartered 60 years ago, is committed to that goal.

Your new member kit is filled with educational material to start you on your journey. I have listed some of the things that will enable you to prepare and deliver your speeches with the least amount of anxiety and fear. Consider the following:

1. Carefully review the guidelines for each speech in your CC manual. Review the "Objectives" box which defines the goals for your speech. Underscore points to help you prepare the text of your speech. Review the questions and comments found in the evaluator's page.
2. Prepare a short introduction for the Toastmaster of the Day. This is to include the title, purpose, and time for your speech.
3. When you are called to the lectern, shake the hand of the Toastmaster of the day.
4. Always be sure to address your audience. "Fellow Toastmasters and most welcome guests" is appropriate.
5. Place your notes on the lectern. Gently slide them across the lectern as you use them. Do not turn them over as this is a distraction to your audience.
6. Select a person on each side and in the middle of the room to make eye contact with – preferably a friendly face.
7. When timing your speech, allow for audience reaction to your message. Use pauses and vocal variety to emphasize a point.
8. Select topics you feel strongly about and then speak from your heart as well as your head.
9. When using props, have them set up prior to your speech.
10. Do not thank your audience. Remember you are among friends, your fellow Toastmasters who wish you well. Their applause is your thanks.
